## Topic

This half-term, our topic lessons will explore different types of forces through lots of fun experiments.

In cooking, we'll be practising the skill of kneading by making some delicious recipes every Friday morning (pre-warning - they may not make it home to you!)

In Art, we'll be learning about 'Pop Art' and creating our own bright and colourful pieces inspired by this style.

Our Computing lessons will focus on online safety and how we can keep ourselves safe when using the internet.

In PSHE, we'll be learning about rules and laws, the different kinds we see in everyday life, and why they are important. As we get closer to the Easter break, we'll revisit the Easter Story to learn about why Christians celebrate Easter.

## Maths

In Maths, we will continue strengthening our understanding of number and begin exploring multiplication during our operations lessons.

In our Area of Study sessions, we will be learning about 'mass and weight'. Where we will use lots of practical equipment to measure, compare, and describe the mass of different objects.

## PE

This term, Eagles Class will continue to visit the gym for our PE lessons every Monday morning.

## Home Learning Ideas

Thank you for continuing to support your child's reading at home using their reading packs. Please see below some other learning opportunities you may want to take part in at home:

Find things around your home that you can push and pull.

Play with playdough to practice kneading.

Practise number bonds by finding two numbers that make another number (e.g.,  $3 + 2 = 5$ ). You can use toys, snacks etc to help.

## English

This half-term, our English sessions will focus on non-fiction texts. We'll be exploring different types of information books while continuing to develop our word reading and comprehension skills. In our writing sessions, we will use colourful semantics to help us practise building and writing clear sentences to caption pictures and diagrams in the texts we read.
